(Optional) COAT COLOR TESTING:

Check box for desired test.

(The IKBPA does encourage owners to test their ponies to help establish a database on how color is produced in the Kerry Bog bloodstock, and is helpful for breeders to determine color genetics for future offspring.)

- Agouti** (identifies if pony possesses 1 or 2 copies of the gene for the bay coloring- black points concentrating on legs, mane/tail, and tips of ears)
- Cream Dilution** (identifies if pony possesses 1 or 2 copies of the gene for the coloring of palomino/cremello, buckskin/perlino, or smokey black/smokey cream)
- Dun** (identifies if pony possesses 1 or 2 copies of the gene for dun- zebra stripes on lack of legs and line along the dorsal)
- Gray** (identifies if pony possesses 1 or 2 copies of the gene for gray- foals will turn gray with age)
- Leopard Complex** (identifies if pony possesses 1 or 2 copies of the gene for the varnish roan or blanket appaloosa look)
- Red Factor** (defines the base coat colors of chestnut or black; identifies if pony is either homozygous black or a carrier of red (chestnut) pigment)
- Roan Zygoty** (identifies if pony possesses 1 or 2 copies of the gene for roaning- white and colored hairs intermixed throughout the body while the head, lower legs, mane and tail remain colored)
- Tobiano** (identifies if pony possesses 1 or 2 copies of the tobiano (painted/broken colour) gene)

Step 7: Coat Color

- If you know for sure what the coat color of your pony is, please indicate here.
- Check only one color from the list.
- If unsure of the coat color, please complete a coat color test in the section above. The results will be noted on the foal's pedigree.
 - I am unsure of my pony's coat color and have checked the suspected colors in the "COAT COLOR TESTING" section.
 - Bay (shades from reddish tan to dark mahogany brown. Black mane, tail, ear tips, and below the knees and hocks.)
 - Black (true black without any light areas.)
 - Brown (black with light auburn areas at muzzle, eyes, flanks, and inside of legs.)
 - Buckskin (golden tan to bronze. Black mane, tail, ear tips, and below knees and hocks.)
 - Chestnut (shades from golden red to dark reddish brown. Mane, tail, and legs are the color of the body or shades lighter or darker. Dark chestnuts may look black with the exception of red hairs on the coronet, pasterns, and/or back of fetlocks.)
 - Cremello (ivory colored coat in shades from very light to darker cream color. Mane and tail are ivory or flaxen. Light pinkish skin and blue or bluish green eyes.)
 - Palomino (shades of very pale creamy yellow to golden yellow, with flaxen, silver, or white mane and tail.)
 - Perlino (ivory colored coat in shades from very light to darker cream color. Mane and tail may be slightly darker than body. Light pinkish skin and blue or bluish green eyes. Points may be darker than its body.)
 - Smokey Black (varying shades of black. May appear to have a black or brown body. Can be difficult to distinguish from black, dun, chestnut, or brown.)
 - Smokey Cream (ivory colored coat, with or without black overtones. This result is from two cream dilution genes on a black base horse.)

Check any coat characteristics you know may apply:

- Dun (zebra striping on back of legs & one dorsal stripe down the back)
- Gray (coat eventually going gray & ultimately silver white in adulthood)
- Flaxen (blonde or white mane & tail on a chestnut coat)
- Leopard (aka "Varnish Roan", may have light roaning on face, back & flanks, may have light to heavy white blanket on the top of rump, may have black spots in the white. White skin pigmentation may be found around nostrils, mouth, & genitalia)
- Roan (white hairs dispersed throughout body, mixing with the base coat)
- Tobiano (aka "Broken Colour", patches of white throughout body)

Step 8: Eye Color

Step 9: Markings

The Marking Key Code is as follows:

HEAD

Star: A white mark on the forehead, located above the line running from eye to eye.

Strip: A white marking extending from the line of the running down the bridge of nose to nostril.

Snip: A white or flesh mark between the nostrils or on the upper or lower lip.

Blaze: A star and strip combined that is more than half as wide as the face at eye level and includes both nostrils.

Bald Face: A wide blaze that extends to or around the eyes or nostrils, with most of the upper lip also being white.

FEET

Heel: A white marking found on the back of the foot.

Coronet: A white marking extending to approximately 1 inch above the hoof.

Pastern: A white marking extending to the top of the pastern.

Fetlock: A white marking extending to the top of the fetlock (ankle).

Sock: A white marking extending to midway on the cannon.

Stocking: A white marking extending above midway on the cannon.

BODY

Blanket: Large white area covering the top rear section. (For ponies with Leopard gene only)

Spots: Black or dark pigmented spots located within white.

Roan Spots: Areas of white hairs mixed into the basic coat color that does not have underlying pink skin.

Ben dór Spots: Randomly distributed small to large spots or color that range from a couple of shades darker than the base coat to almost black.

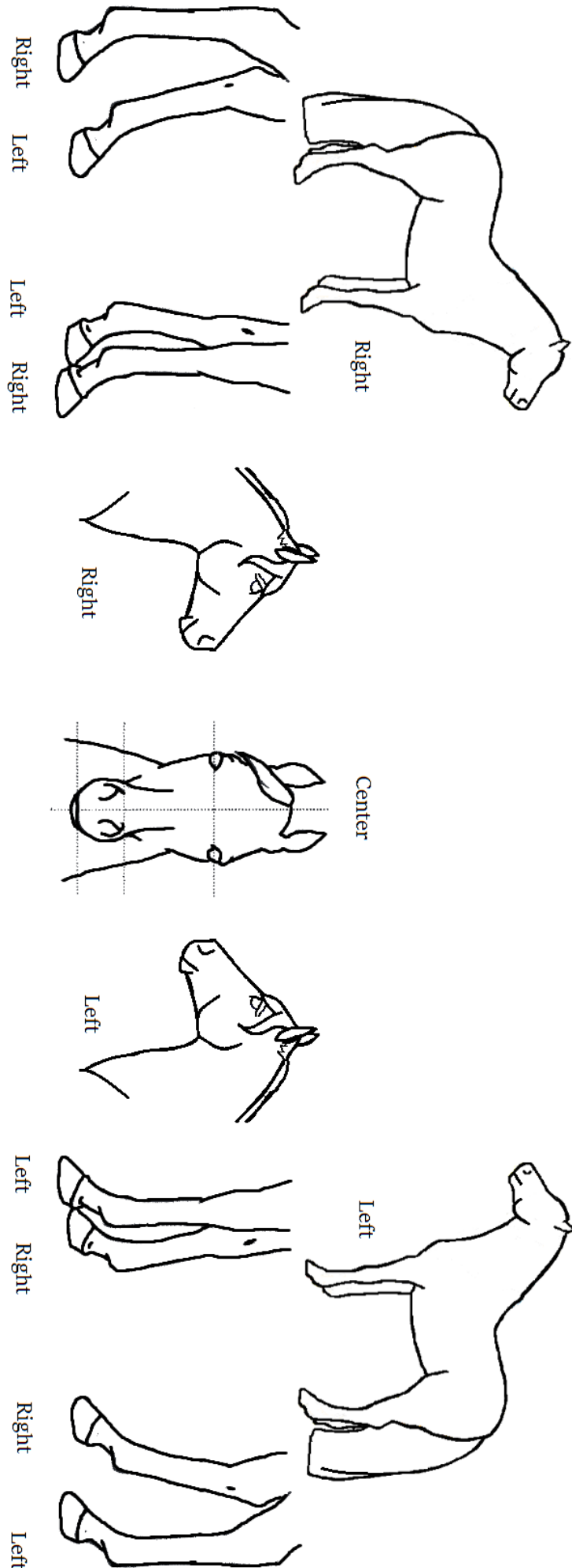
